Stuff about this guide	
What this quide has in it:	

I made this guide because animal crossing is so fun I had to share it with the world. I hope this guide can help you in any way. This guide has just about anything I could get my hands on. I just gathered as much information as I could on this game and decided to list it on a guide. I just started to make this guide and since I'm not some loser who spends 18 hours a day making this guide it might be fairly small. But I'm going to keep adding and adding and adding on to this guide until I've covered everything in the entire game, which could take years!!! Anyhow, I hope you enjoy it nevertheless!

Versions:

Version 1.0: The only one there is right now. Completed Part 1, 2, and part of parts 3 & 4. Since this is only the first version of my guide I will add more soon and continue what the table of contents says. I didn't fell like Putting Animal Crossing in big writing with all those dashes and stuff so I just wrote animal Crossing. Starting off:

You'll start off on a train in first person mode with only a weird warthog in the back- right corner sleeping (Her name is Sow Joan, go to part 3 to see who she is). A blue cat will walk in named Rover (Weird name for a cat) who seems kind of cool at first but if you travel to different towns he'll get really annoying. Anyways, he'll basically ask you the time, your name and the town you're going to. Answer questions 1, 4, and 5 the way you would in real life because it reflects what your eyes will look like in the game. I suggest that you pick all the mean choices like, "leave me alone" and stuff a bully would say because it will give you these punk-style eyes. He will ask you if you bought a place yet and then will call Tom Nook to get one. He will finally ask you if you have any money and if you want the punk eyes you need to say you have just a little. Finally it's time to get off the train. When you get off at your new town Tom Nook (Owner of Nook's crannies) will run up to you and offer you a house. The only big difference is the color of the roof so just pick the one with your favorite color roof. He'll then ask for you to pay. When you realize that you can only pay 1000 bells of the 19,800 bells he tells you to meet him at his shop. This is where you start paying off your house.

Working at Nook's:

Now it's time to start paying off your house. The first task that Nook will request is to plant some flowers and tree saplings around his shop. Since all you need to do is plant them and it doesn't matter where, I planted them around my house. Next he will tell you to meet all of the people in the town, including the mayor. The mayor always gives out free stuff at special events that you can't buy at the shop but it's too bad he had to be an old turtle b_tch instead of a cool animal like a lion or wolf. You should have six people in your town. The six people I started out with were Goldie, Cesar (My favorite:)), Pudge, Bill, Twiggy, and Blaire. Maybe you got someone that I have! Next he will ask you to deliver some furniture to a random animal. Deliver it. Since I'm way past this part I might not have this order correct but I think you have to write a

letter to someone. Write it to that specific person. Next he will let you take a break and do favors for the townsfolk. All you need to do is one thing but if you want to do more you can. Next Tom Nook will want you to deliver a carpet to someone. Do it. Then he will ask you to deliver an axe. Unfortunately you can't use it but it is one of the four major tools which are shovel, axe, fishing rod and net. Then he will finally ask you to write a message on the bulletin board in front of your house. Now that you've finished all of your work you are free to roam about!

Paying off your debt:

Even though your done working for Nook doesn't mean that you paid of all your debt. You still have a lot of money left to pay off! That house you got there is pretty small and if you've been inside other animal's houses you will see that their house is six by six. You can increase your house to that size if you pay off all of your debt. Look at the next section if you want to know more about the extensions. There are plenty of ways to make the money. The most common thing to do is to do favors for your neighbors. If you're lucky enough to find that the fishing rod is in Nook's store you can buy it and start catching fish. Once you caught some fish you can sell it to Nook for a good price. Likewise, if the net is in the shop you can catch and sell bugs. If the shovel is in the shop you can do more than one thing. You can do the money rock technique where one rock in the town has money (See tips and tricks) or if you find a shiny spot on the ground you can dig up 1,000 bells usually (I once dug up 30,000 bells and my friend Dan was there to witness it). If you don't see any of those in the store you can go around shaking trees and collecting fruit. You can sell the fruit that is common in your town for 100 bells and any other fruits for 500 bells! The more you pay off your debt the more extensions you'll get.

All of the extensions and stuff about them:

There is a total of four extensions that you are offered. They are all offered by Nook whenever you finish paying off a debt. Below is a list of the four extensions.

- 1. When you finish paying of your very first debt you are offered an enlargement for your house. The house is enlarged to a six by six just like all of your neighbors' houses. The house costs 148,000 bells.
- 2. The next extension is a basement. I was surprised when I first saw it because it is eight by eight squares. And to top it all off it only costs 50,000 bells! Your neighbors can't get any other extensions so they won't have this one.
- 3. The next extension is to enlarge your first story. It gets enlarged to an eight by eight, which is surprisingly big. The only downside to this is that it costs 398,000 bells!
- 4. The final upgrade is a second story. The second story is only six by six yet you wouldn't believe the price...800,000! I think Nook's ripping you off...

-Bonus-

After you've paid of all of your debt for the second story Nook will build a statue of you! I don't know much about this since I still have to pay of most of my second story debt(It takes forever).

Everything about the town:

Every town is 30 square acres. Whenever you're walking outside and the screen changes to another area that means you're changing acres. In every town there is Tom Nook's store, which sells stuff. There is also the post office. You're probably familiar with it if you delivered that letter for Nook. There is

also the garbage dump where you can find items that people throw away. The police station does two things. If you lost an item by dropping it somewhere it will be there in the lost and found. The lost and found is also a place where you can collect freebies-even if they're not yours! You can also ask them if anything is going on in town (Look at part D's 3 section). There's also the Able Sisters where you can make your own designs and where them! There also is a wishing well. The wishing well tells you what acres are in need in your town. The museum is a place where you can donate bugs, fish, fossils, and paintings. To donate a fossil you have to unbury one on an x mark and then send it to the farway museum. They will send it back to you identified. You can buy paintings. I'm pretty sure that in every town there is a lake. The lake is where the river forms a big glob, taking up and entire acre. There finally is a dock by the ocean where you can go to Animal Island if you hook in the Gameboy Advance (tips and tricks). Oh, and there is also a train station. See more about that in the tips and tricks section.

Here's a bunch of cool things I found. These are actually GOOD tricks that most people don't know about so there won't be many. Well, whatever.

Some tips and tricks:

- 1.) This technique is called the money-rock technique. Once a day in your town there is a rock that gives you money. You have to hit it with your shovel to make it give out money. It can be hard since it looks just like any other rock to find it. When you hit the right rock it will turn red. Every three times you hit it you will hear a 1-up sound(a classic Mario chime) and another zero will be added to the amount of money(100 to 1000 to 10000, etc.)
- 2.) Having trouble getting 10000 bells on the money rock technique? First try digging some holes so you're in between the holes and the rock. Then hit the rock as fast as you can with your AXE, because it hits faster than your shovel. It also helps if you have the golden axe because it doesn't break.
- 3.) To change the background on the item screen(pause menu) grab your favorite shirt and drag it down to the bottom-right of the item screen. Then carry it down one more space and it will go into a blank area. Place it in that area and the design on that shirt will appear in the background! To get your shirt back grab the other shirt that appeared (The original design for the pause screen, a dot shirt) and put it in the blank area.
- 4.) First mail a really cool T-shirt to one of your favorite neighbors. Then, after you send it wait a few days. A few days later find the person you sent the letter to. He'll be wearing the shirt you sent him.
- 5.) If you're having trouble selling a bunch of items you have you can press X on all of them to sell them all at once. If you do it correctly Tom Nook will add up all of the cost of them. You can also do this if you want to drop a bunch of items.
