Introduction to the Game

Wheel of Fortune: Featuring Vanna White is a trivia game based on the ever-popular TV game show. It was developed by GameTek and released for the Nintendo Entertainment System in 1992.

Starting a Game

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To begin, you will choose the number of human players that will participate. Fill any empty spaces with computers. Then you will select the difficulty of the AI, which is broken into three tiers. The first tier (1) is laughably easy while the third (3) is frustrating unless you have played the game enough times to recognize the puzzle patterns. Third tier computers seem to know the puzzle as soon as it comes up...I'm looking at you, Pat Sajak. Enter the names of the human players and the game will start.

Figuring Out the Game

Wheel of Fortune is broken down into three rounds of increasing difficulty. When it is your turn, you will be given a choice of three possible actions:

Spin the Wheel - If you can't solve the puzzle then this is your primary action. There are various sections of the wheel. Some offer money while others punish you for bad luck. If you spin and the wheel lands on the \$300 card, you guess a consonant. You will receive \$300 every time that consonant appears in the puzzle. If the consonant doesn't appear or you land on the "Bankrupt" card, you will lose your turn.

Buy a Vowel - Use whatever funds you have established from previous turns to purchase A, E, I, O or U. This option is helpful if you think you are close to solving the puzzle. Otherwise you are just making it easier for your opponents. All vowels cost \$250. The game will notify you when there are only vowels left.

Solve the Puzzle - If you have figured out the phrase on the board, type it in to win the round.

A Few Helpful Tips

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If you can solve the puzzle but there are still numerous blanks left, spin the wheel a couple times to earn some cash. You do, however, risk landing on the "Bankrupt" card or the "Miss Turn" card.

The "Free Spin" card allows you to continue your turn even if you land on the "Bankrupt" card.

Round three is the speed round. The wheel spins at the beginning of the game

to obtain a fixed dollar amount. Each player can guess one letter on his or her turn, receiving the that amount every time that letter appears on the board. After that, you must solve or pass up your turn.

The Bonus round is for the player who has earned the most money in the three previous rounds. You choose five consonants and a vowel. Those letters will be revealed in your puzzle and then you will have 15 seconds to guess.

People, Phrases, Titles, Places, Events and Things are the categories that appear in this game.

The five most common consonants are: T - N - S - R - L\*

The five least common consonants are: Q - X - Z - J -  $K^*$ 

List of vowels from most common to least common: E - A - O - I - U\*

\*All lists apply to this game, not the English language in general.
