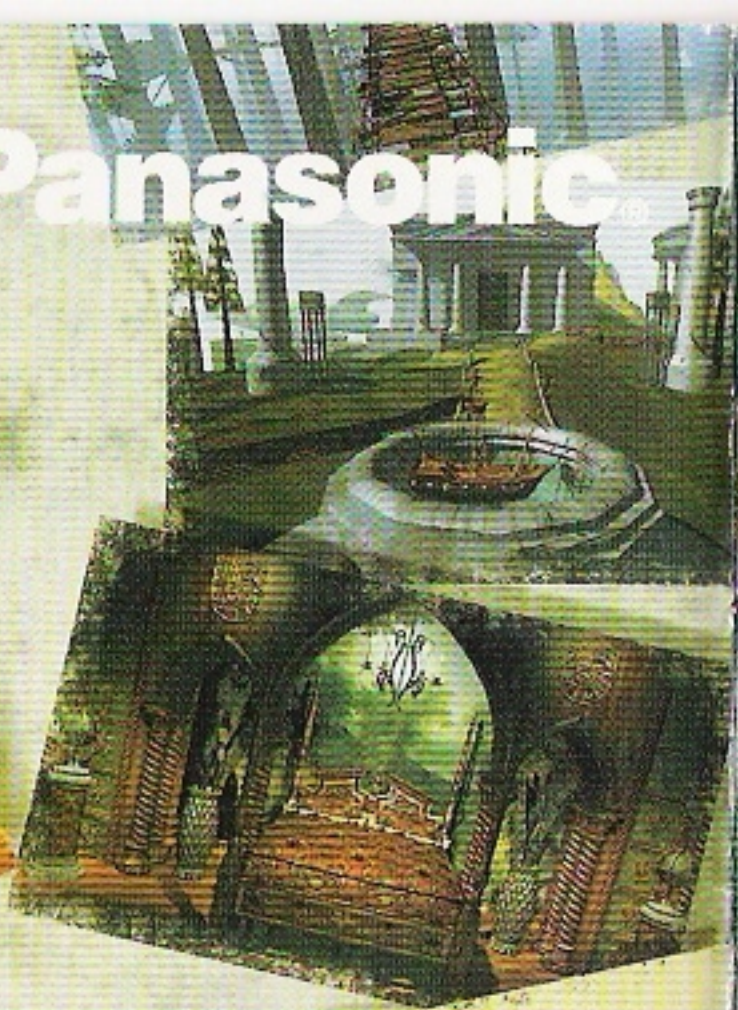

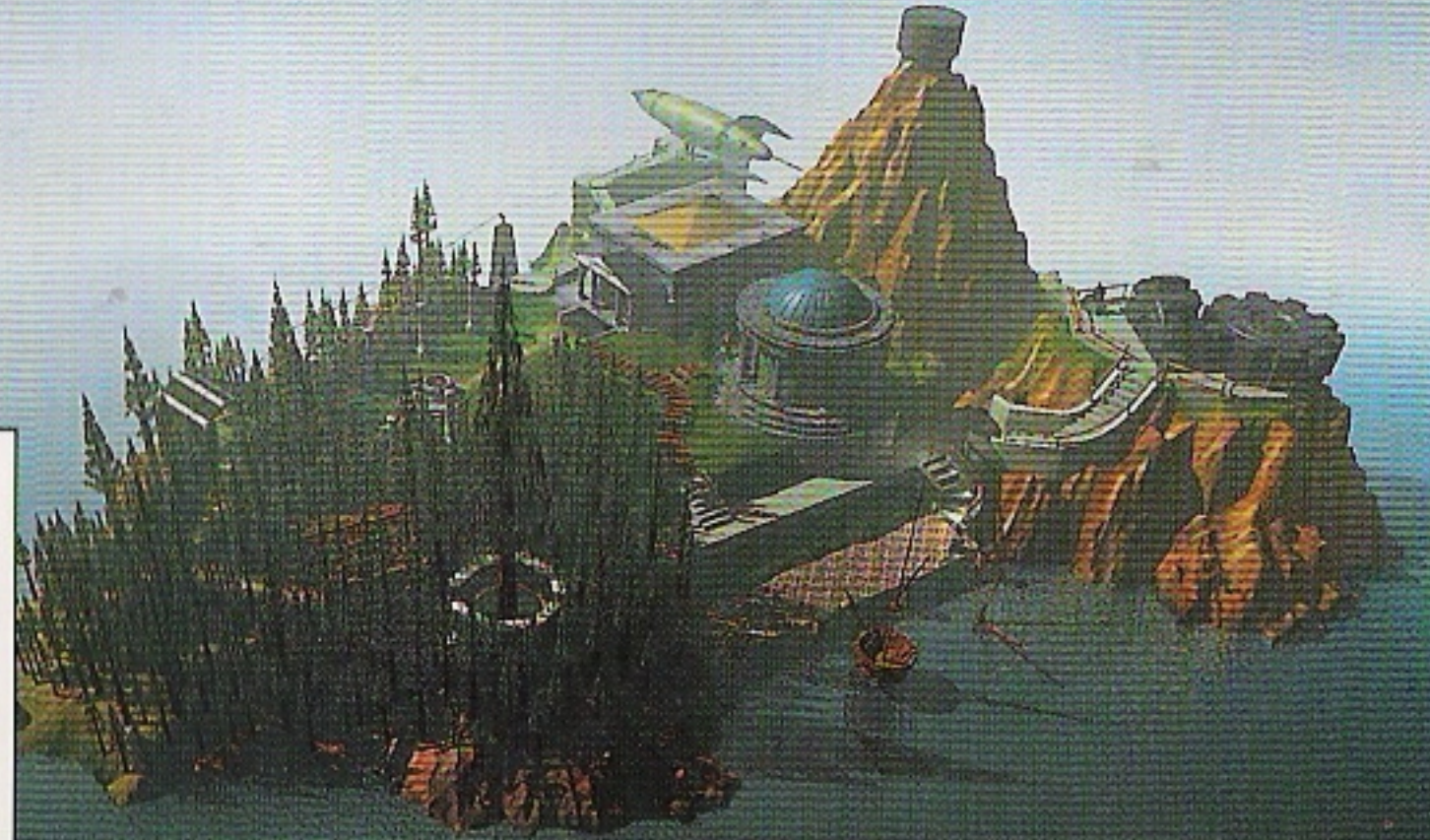

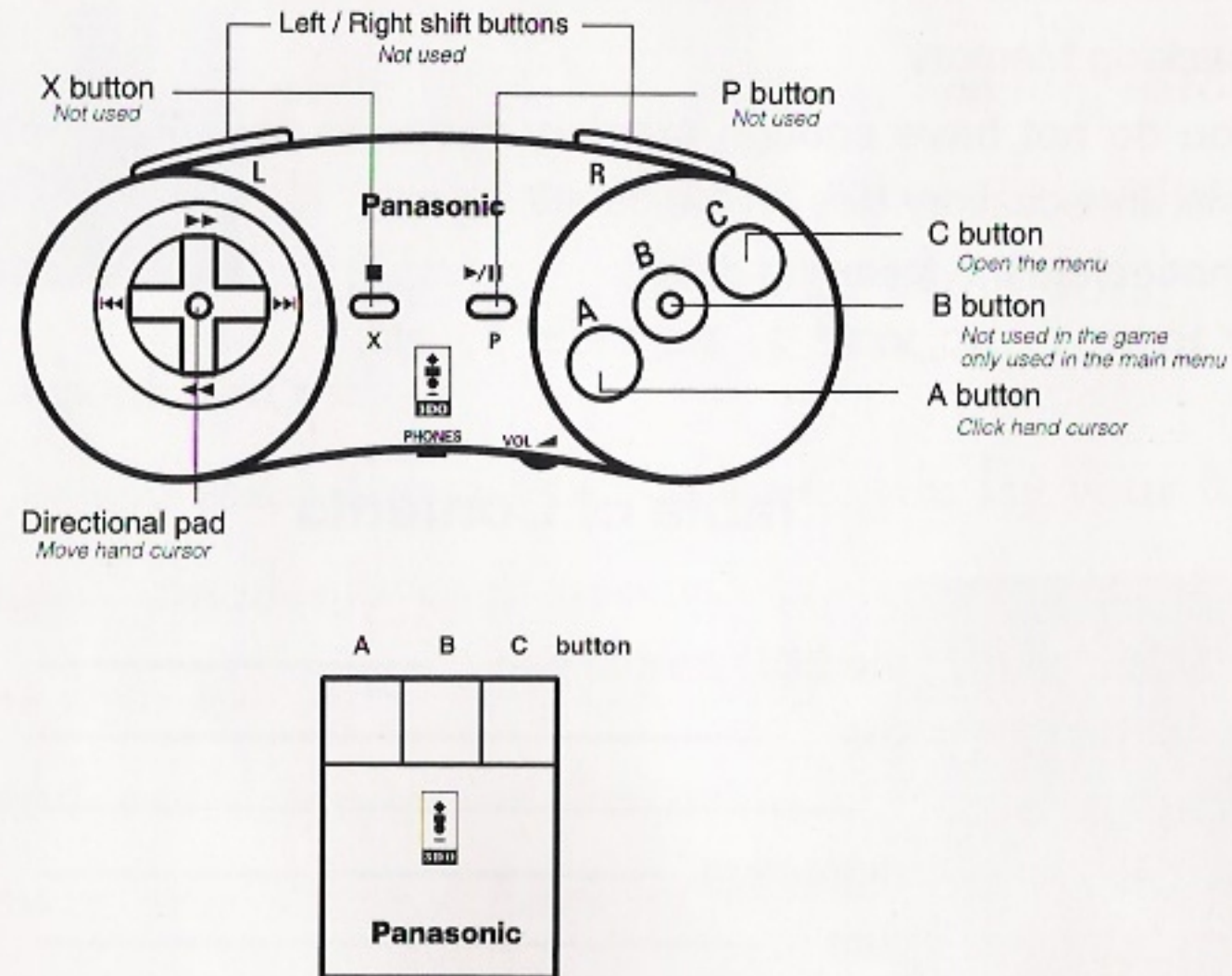

Basic operation of the 3DO control pad and mouse



How to start the game

■ How to start the game

1. Turn on the power to the 3DO system.
2. Open the disc tray or lid and insert MYST CD-ROM. (CD label must be faced up).
3. Close the disc tray or lid. The opening movie starts automatically.
4. If the control pad button or mouse button is pressed during the movie, the movie will be stopped, and start the game.

■ Save & Load

If the C button is pressed during the game, the options menu will open. In this screen, you can Save or Load.

■ Quit

If you select the Quit from the menu opened by the C button, you can see the credits. The Quit will end the game, therefore, save the data beforehand.

Playing the Game

■ Moving around

If the hand Cursor is moved with the directional pad or the mouse, its shape will be changed. When the finger shape does not indicate an object in the next page, it indicates front / back / left / right based on the location in the screen. At this time, if the A button is pressed, you can move toward the direction it indicates. When you use the mouse, the left button will be used as the A button, as in the drawing on page 4.



If the direction is limited in such case as the location is adjacent to the wall, the shape of the hand cursor may not be changed. In this case, if the A button is pressed around the center of the screen, you can move to the direction. If the A button is pressed around the edge of the screen, you can get rid of the point.

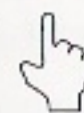


■ Manipulating object

An object can be taken or moved with the following two methods.

Just press the A button.

If the cursor indicates an object such as a switch, it will be finger shaped. In this case, when the A button is pressed, you can turn on the switch or take the object.



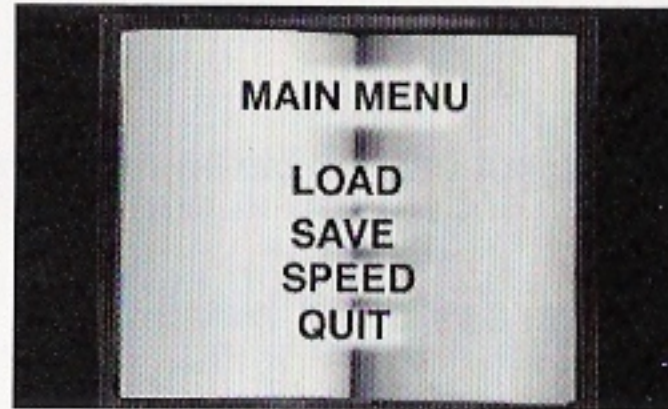
Pull and move

If the cursor is shaped as the open hand, the indicated object can be pulled and moved. Then if the A button is pressed, the shape of the cursor will be changed into the grip hand. If the directional pad is pressed or the mouse is moved while the A button is being pressed, the object can be moved.



Save/Load and Configuration

If the C button is pressed during the game, the options menu will open. This menu is the main menu. The finger cursor will disappear and the selected item will be enclosed in a frame that lights up.



If the up or down arrow key of the directional pad is pressed once, then a selected item will be changed. When the mouse is used, each move up or down can change the selected item.

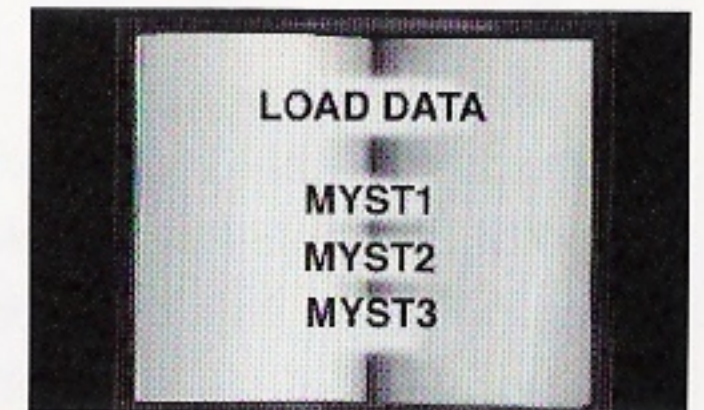
If the A button is pressed after a right item is selected, the menu of the selected item will appear. On this menu screen, the B button can be used as a cancel key, therefore, the B button will bring back the game. The C button will always work as a key that brings back the game.

Load Data

The items indicated in red have been saved.

The ones in blue are vacant.

Press the A button after selecting an item in red using the directional pad on the control pad or the mouse. Then the confirmation message will appear, and press the A button to read the saved data. If the B button is pressed, you can back up to the item selection.

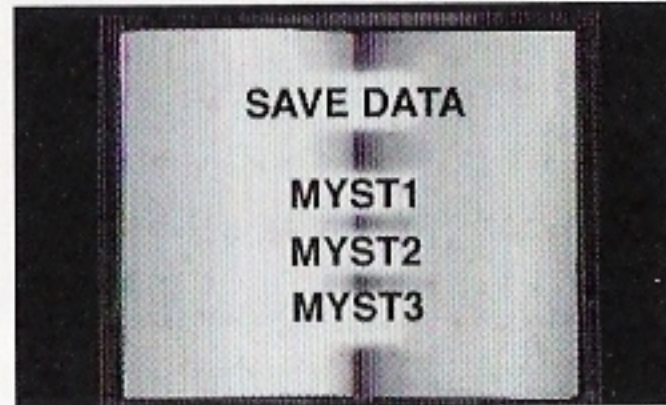


If you load data, the contents of the previous game will be lost and will be replaced with the saved data. Then the game screen will appear. During the selection of the load items, the B button will lead to the main menu, and the C button will bring you back to the game.

Save Data

The red items have been saved once or more. The blue items are vacant.

Select the items to be saved using the directional pad or the mouse, and press the A button. The confirmation message



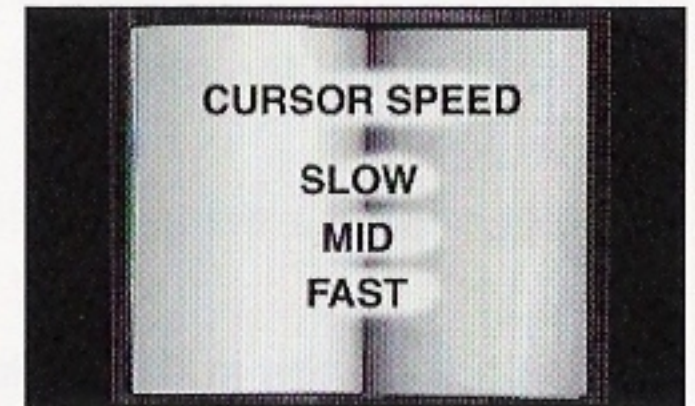
will be indicated, and it can be saved by pressing the A button. If you press the B button, the screen will go back to the item selection screen. If you save data onto the items in red, the old data will be replaced with the new contents.

The data saving does not have any effect on the contents of the game in play.

During the selection of an item to save, the B button will bring back the main menu and the C button will bring back the game.

Cursor speed

For the selection of the speed of the cursor movement, select your favorite items with the directional pad or the mouse, and press the A button. There is no cancel key for the selection, therefore re-select the cursor speed.



You can back up to the main menu by pressing the B button and back up to the game by pressing the C button.

Quit

You can see the credits, and quit game. The Quit will end the game, therefore, save the data beforehand.

Guide to the Adventure

You have entered into the world of "MYST", unexpectedly.

The world is full of mystery. You don't know where to go or what to do, start to examine the place: Planetarium, Spaceship, a huge wheel, and various books...

Investigate all the things you find here, and analyze their state of conditions.

Action During the Game

As the adventure goes on, you will find several Items, Switches and Doors. You can get closer and check them out by adjusting the cursor and pressing buttons A, B or C. Precautions

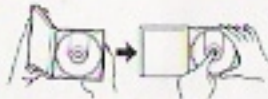
MEDICAL PRECAUTIONS:

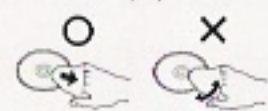
COMPACT DISC USAGE PRECAUTIONS



To open the case, gently press both sides of its top.
To remove the CD from the case, press the center holder and lift the CD, holding by the edges.



To return the CD to the case, insert the CD with the label facing upward, and press downward at the center.



If the surface is soiled, wipe gently with a soft, damp cloth (dampened with water only). Always move the cloth directly outward from the center of the CD, not in a circular motion.
