





- TABLE OF CONTENTS

Set up your PlayStation™ game console according to the instructions in its Instruction Manual. Make sure the power is off before inserting or removing a compact disc. Insert the Ridge Racer disc and close the CD door. Insert game controllers and turn on the PlayStation™ game console. Follow on-screen instructions to start a game.


STARTING THE GAME



When you insert the disc, the "Ridge Racer" Title Screen will be displayed. Follow the messages and press the Start Button. When you press it, the Game Mode Selection Screen will come up. At this screen you can choose a variety of play settings.

SETTING THE PLAY MODE

The items you can choose from at the Game Mode Selection Screen are: Transmission, Music, Course and Car. When you finish choosing, press the Start Button and the game will start. If you choose Option, the Option Selection Screen will come up.



CHOOSING A TRANSMISSION

Automatic – The gears will shift automatically to match the speed. This is good for beginners.

Manual - You can freely change the gears yourself. This is good for experts.

CHOOSING MUSIC

Sound Select – You can choose the Music that runs during game play. Also you can enjoy playing just the music by choosing the Music Player Mode Option.

CHOOSING A COURSE

Beginner – This mode is the simplest for beginners and has two laps. The car's top speed is held down, control is easy and the time limit is set longer. Try out this course first.

Mid-level — This course has three laps and the top speed of the car is increased. It is a little harder to control than the beginner's level. When you can easily finish the beginner's level, try this one.

High-level – The top speed is the same as the intermediate level and there are three laps. However, the road is more narrow and a technical section with more sharp curves is added. Also, the time limit is shorter and the settings are more difficult.

TIME TRIAL – This is a one-on-one time trial against the computer. Your top speed is the fastest of all the modes and control is much more difficult. This course is similar to the expert course.

CHOOSING YOUR CAR

To move through the car selections, press the left and right direction keys. To select a car press the [o] button.



SETTING OPTIONS

If you choose Option at the Game Mode Selection Screen, the Option Selection Screen will come up. You can choose the following three items in the Option Mode:





Before the curve, remove your foot from the gas pedal for an instant and brake.



If you step on the gas pedal while giving the steering wheel a big turn, you will start to drift.

USING THE STANDARD CONTROLLER

Left and right Direction Keys – Use to turn the steering wheel left and right while racing. Use for cursor movement when making selections.

Start Button - Use to pause, restart, or exit race.

R1 and R2 Buttons - Use to shift up while racing.

L1 and L2 Buttons - Use to shift down while racing.

DEFAULT SETTINGS

- ▲ **Button** Use it to change views and to cancel when making selections.
- Button Use it to select options.
- X Button Use it to accelerate and to select options.
- Button Use it to brake and cancel selections.

EXPLANATION OF THE SCREEN/RULES

Lap time - Displays the lap time for each circuit.

Ranking - Displays current ranking.

Time Left – Displays the time left. When it reaches zero the game ends. If you pass the check point within the allotted time, the remaining time will be added to the next lap.

Map – Displays the course and your car's position. The red arrow indicates your car and the yellow one the top car.

Best Time - The fastest lap time recorded in the race up to now.

Total - The fastest total time up to now.

Gear Position Display - Displays what gear you are in.

Tachometer - A meter that displays the engine revolutions.

Speed Indicator - Displays the current speed.

If you press the Start Button during the game, Cancel/Restart/Exit will be displayed. Choose a Direction Key and press Start again.

Cancel: cancels pause.

Restart: runs the course again.

Exit: returns you to the Game Mode Selection Screen.
